



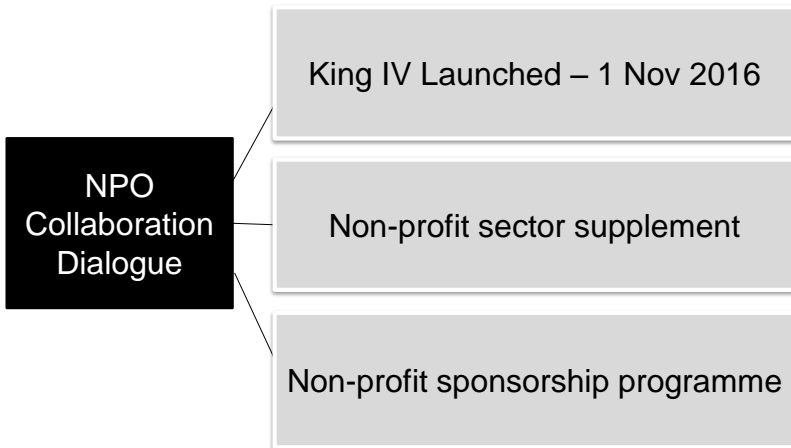

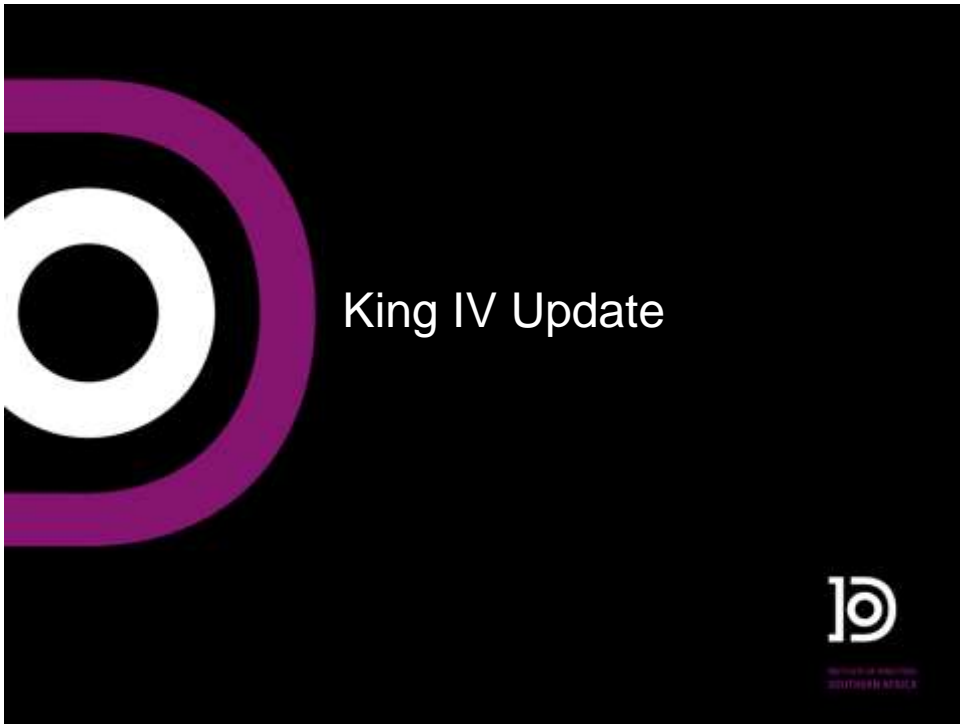

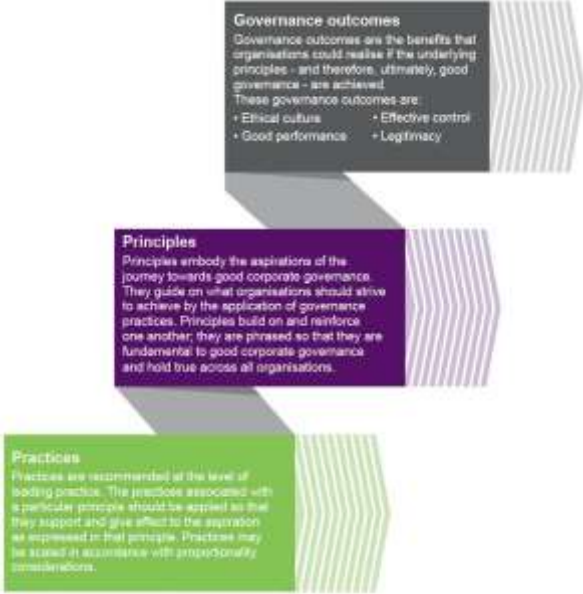
Corporate governance is ... the exercise of **ethical and effective leadership** by the governing body towards the achievement of the following governance outcomes:

- Legitimacy

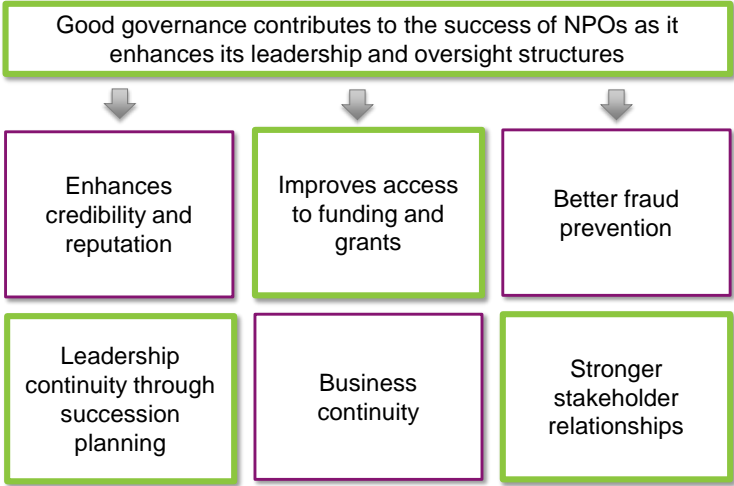

Sponsorship Programme
